You'll complete the program in just 12 months with a cohort of other professionals—a close-knit community where you'll acquire cross-industry expertise from your classmates, while developing a strong network of future supply chain leaders.


Throughout your program you'll receive comprehensive coaching to prepare you for your next step. And we make it easy to take the first step, too: You don't need a GMAT/GRE score to apply and may even qualify for a streamlined admission process.

Program Overview

You'll complete the Master of Science in Supply Chain Management program in just one year. It starts in August and consists of four seven-week terms throughout the traditional academic year, plus an 11-week capstone project over the summer.

Each term, you'll take two in-person courses taught by top-ranked faculty, plus one online or condensed class. Because the program is designed for working professionals, you'll typically attend in-person classes from 5:45 to 9:00 p.m., with some online classes and condensed courses on select Saturdays.

Over the summer, you'll also complete an experiential capstone project with a small team of your classmates to address a real-world global supply chain problem. You'll benefit from networking with the companies that sponsor the projects. It's a great opportunity to develop your leadership skills while getting hands-on experience.

She has conducted extensive research into methods for coordinating inventory and distribution across supply chains, while her behavioral work examines how humans make decisions in supply chain settings.



Curriculum Highlights

Your coursework will elevate your leadership skills while teaching you to manage supply chains from end-to-end. The curriculum is based on five key principles: leadership, strategic orientation, global perspective, analytics, and social responsibility.

This 32-credit program will help you master core supply chain topics at both a practical and a strategic level. You'll also sharpen your analytical capabilities while learning about emerging trends in the field—including insights from the COVID-19 pandemic and other recent high-impact supply chain events.

Experiential Learning

Another vital component of the program is the Global Operations Capstone course. For 11 weeks over the summer, you and a small group of classmates will apply what you've learned in a real-world consulting project for an external client.

Your capstone course project will have global, strategic, and supply chain components. As a result, by the end, you will have hands-on experience with much of the end-to-end supply chain, including topics ranging from market entry to warehouse rationalization.

During the entire experience, you'll also be supported by a professional director with significant industry experience, academic faculty who serve as subject matter experts, and other resources from across the Carlson School.

Admissions

The Carlson School carefully considers each applicant's demonstrated and potential abilities. Our admissions committee takes a holistic approach to reviewing applications and is dedicated to building a diverse class of well-qualified students. The application process allows us to get to know you and the unique skills and experiences you'll bring to the program.

Beyond the process outlined below, you can apply for a 15% or 50% merit scholarship. Applicants residing in and authorized to work in the United States are eligible for these scholarships. An additional essay will be required when you're admitted if you want to be considered for these scholarships.

The Carlson School also supports active military members and veterans who'd like to transition to a corporate role. In addition, students who are employees at the Carlson School's Corporate Discount partner companies are eligible for a 15% tuition discount and a streamlined admission process.
